Nigel is also responsible for the stewardship management and ongoing development of the Woodhouse Ridge woodlands.

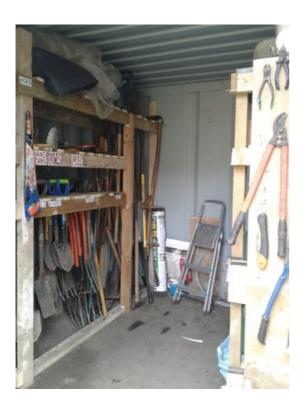
Doug Louis, who has represented the Parks and Countryside department of Leeds City Council in securing and developing the project. It is the Education department that have the site vested within their portfolio but they delegated its oversight to the Parks and Countryside team. Thanks to both departments Mercia Southon, who first identified the unused bramble- and bindweed-choked site as a possible community resource, sought and gained permission and funding to initiate the project, and created the quarter-mile wildlife corridor hedge that extends from it to the woodland of Woodhouse Ridge. Mercia also led the public campaign to have the path that runs alongside the gardens and the wildlife corridor hedge registered as a public footpath.

EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

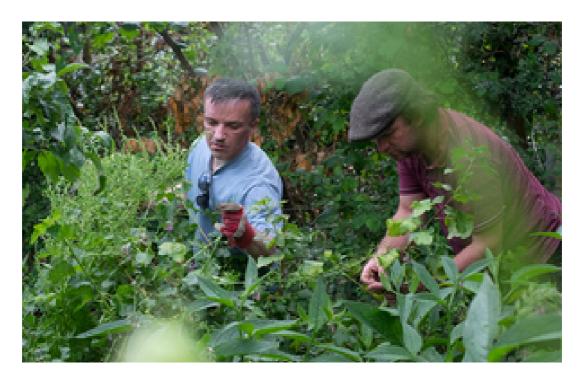
WE ARE AN ORGANISATION THAT WELCOMES EVERYONE
